★ ABOUT THE PLAYS ★



***Tomás and the Library Lady* by José Cruz González:**

This bi-lingual play tells the the boyhood story of Tomás Rivera and how he befriended a librarian in Iowa who encouraged him to read. Tomás, the child of migrant farm workers, became a writer, a professor, and a national education leader. He ultimately rose to become the Chancellor at the University of California, Riverside, and the campus library now bears his name. The play includes a cast of three with puppets and projections that create a magical journey of discovery. Ages 5+



***What We Remember* by Chelsea Unzner, J. Adán Ruiz and Doy Charnsupharind**

A multicultural coming of age story that incorporates elements of the traditional Thai art of shadow puppetry and multimedia. The story follows Adan and Doy, who hail from Mexico and Thailand, respectively, on a semi-autographical narrative as they navigate and explore the world around them. As the play unfolds, they encounter hardships as well as profound joys, and they will discover that although their backgrounds may be very different, their souls are brothers. Ages 10+



***Bloom: A Sensory Adventure* by Fuse Theatre:**

Join Ant, Squirrel, Bee, and Bird on a magical journey as they work together to awaken a sleeping tree. But they can't do it alone - they need your help! On our adventure, you'll explore each part of the tree that these animals call home. We'll move our bodies, raise our voices, and work as a team to get our tree to BLOOM! This immersive, imaginative, and inclusive adventure will be a thrilling sensory experience for 3-5 year olds. Get ready to play, dance, and jump into the fun this spring!

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★ ABOUT FUSE THEATRE ★

Fuse Theatre creates meaningful theatre experiences in order to connect communities, expand perspectives, and foster civic engagement. ★ FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ★

What kind of space is needed?

We need both a clear "stage" area for sets (approx 20'x20') and a space where the audience to gather for the show. A large community room is good. We also like to be on the floor with the audience - not a stage!

What is the touring schedule?

We will work with you to plan a date that works with our schedule and yours. Mostly we schedule weekend and week nights for performances. We also have community workshops available.

What are the workshops like?

Fuse teaching artists will foster creativity and community engagement through activities like puppetry, mask making, and physical theatre games. Each workshop will last around an hour.

What kind of audience is this tour geared towards?

Our productions cover a wide range of ages and will have appeal for adult friends and caregivers, as well!

How long are the plays?

Each of the plays are around 1 hour in length, with no intermission.
